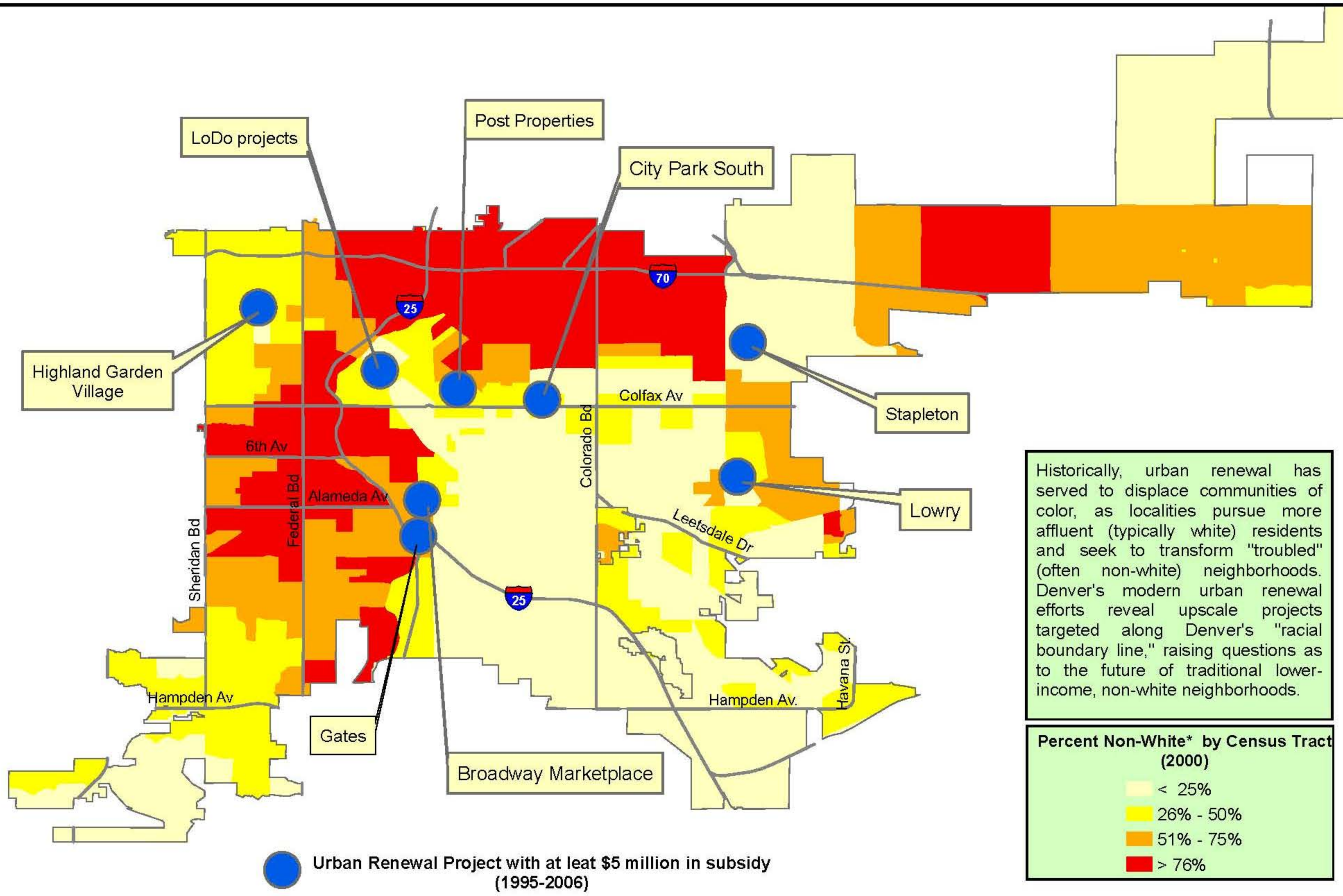


Subsidized Development and Denver's Geography of Race



Historically, urban renewal has served to displace communities of color, as localities pursue more affluent (typically white) residents and seek to transform "troubled" (often non-white) neighborhoods. Denver's modern urban renewal efforts reveal upscale projects targeted along Denver's "racial boundary line," raising questions as to the future of traditional lower-income, non-white neighborhoods.

* "Non-White" includes Whites who identify as "Hispanic" to the U.S. Census.
